

THIEVES Protocol

THEIVES is a textbook preview/notetaking strategy that students can use to get the gist of a reading assignment before reading. (It is also a way to THIEVE the assigned chapter before heading to class without having done their homework.)

T	TITLE: Turn it into a question.
Н	Headings: Turn headings into questions.
Ι	Introduction: Read the opening paragraph or section.
E in the	Every first sentence: Read the first sentence of every paragraph chapter.
V	Visuals: What do charts, pictures, graphs tell you?
E	Ending: Read the summary or questions at the end.
S	So What? What are the most important ideas?

A worksheet for guiding students through the process results in notes that will help students internalize important information and summarize it.
